


Urban and Campus Design

Using the Ito Campus and the Itoshima Peninsula as case studies, we will take a look at how the entire region worked together to create a city and a university. While regions all over the world are clawing their way to industrial development, Kyushu University in Fukuoka, located in western Japan near Asia, has been developing its campus as a stage to showcase its university reform, which was implemented ahead of other universities in Japan. The Kyushu University Ito campus was completed in 2018. The urban development of the surrounding area is currently underway, and we will introduce its plans, ongoing projects, and vacant house projects.





Takeru SAKAI is a Professor at Kyushu University Campus Planning Office, Graduate School of Human-Environment Studies and Department of Architecture. After completing the Graduate School of Engineering, Kyushu University, he was in charge of designing the Asia Pacific Exposition Masterplan and architecture design, Seaside momochi plan, commercial facilities, and so on. He was also in charge of the construction of Across Fukuoka at the Fukuoka Prefecture General Affairs Department. Since 1993, after working as an assistant professor in the Hagishima Laboratory, Department of Architecture, he has been in charge of campus planning for the Ito Campus and other Kyushu University in the Campus Planning Office, and have supported the design and construction of architecture. Currently, he is the chairman of the Fukuoka City Planning Council, the chairman of the Fukuoka Prefecture Beautiful Town Development Council, the chairman of the Asian Townscape Design Society, and the advisor of the Kyushu Branch of the City Planning Institute of Japan. His specialty is city planning and urban landscape.
