Naoko Hikita is a Professor of Department of Health Sciences, Kyushu University. She was born in Hitachinaka City, Ibaraki Prefecture. After obtaining a midwifery license in 2002, she worked in the maternity ward of a general hospital in Ibaraki Prefecture. In May 2008, she was dispatched as a member of the Japan Disaster Relief Team after the major earthquake that occurred in Sichuan, China. From October 2008 to April 2011, she was involved in health projects in the Republic of Malawi as a member of the Japanese NGO. In March 2017, she completed the doctoral program at Department of Health Science and Nursing, Graduate School of Medicine, the University of Tokyo, and worked as a Project Assistant Professor and Assistant Professor at Department of Health Science and Nursing, Graduate School of Medicine, the University of Tokyo. In April 2020, she was appointed a lecturer at the Department of Midwifery, Dokkyo Medical University. In April 2022, she was appointed as a professor of the Department of Health Sciences, Graduate school of Medical Sciences, Kyushu University.

In this seminar, she will share the knowledge that she have clarified through her research activities on what kind of health problems that pregnant and postpartum women in Mongolia are facing. In Mongolia, they have health problems that are different from those in developing countries as you might imagine. She would like everyone to know more about Mongolia and think together about how to solve those problems.
