### **Biography**

Khoo Boo Teik worked as a Senior Researcher in Kuala Lumpur from 1986 to April 1987, followed by a Lecturer position in Brunei from June 1987 to February 1993. He continued as a Lecturer at Universiti Sains Malaysia from 1994 to 1999, advancing to Associate Professor from 2000 to 2009. Later, he served as an Executive Senior Research Fellow at the Institute of Developing Economies (IDE - JETRO) in Japan until March 2014, and from 2014 to 2020, he was a Professor at GRIPS (National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies).

### **Biography**

Filomeno Aguilar is Professor of History and former Dean of the School of Social Sciences, Ateneo de Manila University.

He obtained his PhD degree from Cornell University in 1992. Prior to repatriation in 2003, he taught at the National University of Singapore (1993–1996) and James Cook University (1996–2003). He has served as President of the International Association of Historians of Asia (IAHA, 2005–2006) and Chair of the Philippine Social Science Council (PSSC, 2006–2008).

### **Biography**

Takashi SHIRAISHI has taught at the University of Tokyo (1979-1987), Cornell University (1987-98), Kyoto University (1996-2005), and National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies (GRIPS) in Tokyo (2005-2009). He served as Executive Member, Council for Science and Technology Policy (CSTP), Cabinet Office (2009-2012), President, GRIPS (2011-2017), President, Institute of Developing Economies-JETRO (2007-2018) and Ritsumeikan University Professor (2017). He currently serves as Chancellor, Prefectural University of Kumamoto (since 2018).

### **Biography**

In 1987, Takakazu Yumoto graduated from the Doctoral Program in the Graduate School, Division of Natural Science at Kyoto University. Specializing in ecology, he served as a lecturer in the Faculty of Science at Kobe University, an associate professor at the Center for Ecological Research at Kyoto University, and a professor at the Research Institute for Humanity and Nature at Kyoto University. In 2012, he assumed a position at the Primate Research Institute at Kyoto University.
